PURE BRED IRISH DRAUGHT MARE AND FOAL CLASSES

Ring 1 Judge Mr Derek Walker

Open to all pure bred Irish Draught mares by any graded or ungraded Irish Draught stallion and out of any graded or ungraded Irish Draught mare.

All entries must be registered with HSI or IDHS (GB)

Class 1 Pure bred Irish Draught mare 3 years and over with foal at foot

Class 2 Pure bred Irish Draught filly or colt foal (see rule 8 re colts)

Class 3 Pure bred Irish Draught mare 4 years and over, barren or in foal

Class 4 Pure bred Irish Draught foundation mare 4 years and over, barren, in foal or with foal at foot
to be judged against traditional breed standards as a true to type foundation mare that will benefit the future of the Irish Draught breed

Sp1 Special rosette for highest placed Veteran mare (15 years and over) in class 1

Sp2 Special rosette for highest placed Veteran mare (15 years and over) in class 3

Ch1 Irish Draught Mare Championship for 1st and 2nd placed in classes 1, 3 and 4

PURE BRED IRISH DRAUGHT YOUNGSTOCK CLASSES

Open to all pure bred Irish Draught youngstock by any graded or ungraded Irish Draught stallion and out of any graded or ungraded Irish Draught mare.

All entries must be registered with HSI or IDHS (GB)

Class 5 Irish Draught yearling filly, colt or gelding (see rule 8 re colts)

Class 6 Irish Draught two year old filly, colt or gelding (see rule 8 re colts)

Class 7 Irish Draught three year old filly, uninspected colt or gelding (see rule 8 re colts)

Ch2 Irish Draught Youngstock Championship for 1st and 2nd placed in classes 5, 6 and 7

Ch3 Pure Bred Irish Draught Supreme Championship for Champion and Reserve from Ch1 and Ch2

IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE MARES, FOALS AND YOUNGSTOCK

Exhibits in classes 8 and 9 must be registered with HSI or IDHS (GB)

Class 8 ID Sport Horse yearling filly, colt or gelding (see rule 8 re colts)

Class 9 ID Sport Horse two and three year old filly, uninspected colt or gelding (see rule 8 re colts)

Class 10 ID Sport Horse foal, filly or colt eligible for the HSI or IDSH registers (including foals out of Irish Draught mares by other sires)

Class 11 Any breed brood mare three years and over open to mares of any breeding with foal at foot entered in class 10

Ch4 Irish Draught Sport Horse Championship for 1st and 2nd placed in classes 8, 9 and 10

IN HAND IRISH DRAUGHT AND OPEN IN HAND CLASSES

Class 12 Irish Draught and ID Sport Horse maturity in hand for mares and geldings 4 years and over registered with HSI or IDHS (GB)

Class 13 Open Hunter maturity in hand for mares and geldings 4 years and over

Class 14 Open Hunter youngstock in hand for yearling, two and three year old fillies, colts and geldings (see rule 8 re colts)

SP3 Special rosette for highest placed Irish Draught pure bred in class 12

SP4 Special rosette for highest placed ID Sport Horse in class 12

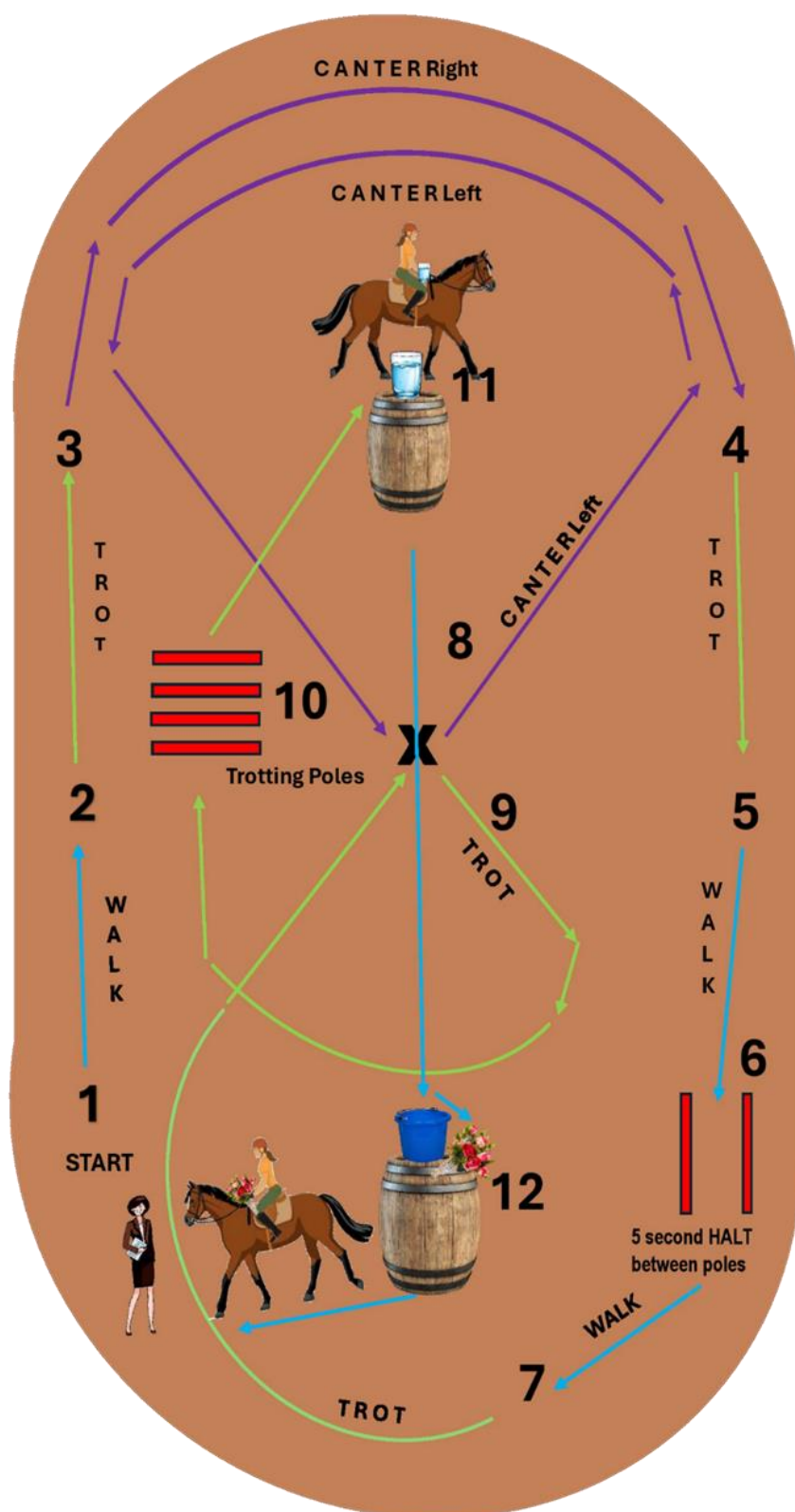
Class 19 Open Equitation Horses to be 4 years and over. There will be a simple set format for an individual show – see *Class 19 Open Equitation Rules below*. Marks will be given for each section and will be judged on manners, way of going and general overall impression. There will be no jumps.

SP5 Special Rosette and Prize for Best Turned out Horse and Rider.

Class 19 Open Equitation Rules

WALK	
TROT	
CANTER	



Enter arena and go to Judge for Turnout assessment.

Start 1. – 2. Walk

2 – 3 Trot

3 - 4 Canter right

4 - 5 Trot

5 - 6 Walk

At 6 Halt for 5 seconds between poles then Walk on to -

7 Trot round to X

8 At X Canter left circle back to X

9 Trot round to right continue over

10 Trotting poles and then to..

11 Barrel 1. Pick up glass of Water proceed to...

12 Barrel 2. Pour water into bucket, place glass on barrel and pick up bunch of flowers. Walk to the Steward and present her the flowers and leave the arena.

Turnout scores are separate.

Marks available -

Walk & Trot 20

Halt 10

Canter 10

Trotting poles 20

Water pick up and pour 20

Flower pick up and presentation 20

TOTAL 100

The class will be judged for accuracy of the test, manners, attitude and general outlook of the horse. If your horse is unhappy with any element of the test just move on to the next part. A nice flowing round will gain points.

Stabling

There is a limited number of elite indoor stables for hire for the duration of the Show available from Saturday evening until Sunday evening at a cost of £100 per box which includes a £20 returnable deposit for leaving the box empty and clean on departure. Bedding is restricted to shavings only which can be pre-ordered at a cost of £12 per bale or you can bring your own. These elite boxes will be allocated on a first come basis on receipt of the appropriate payment.

Temporary stables can also be hired for the duration of the Show available from Saturday evening until Sunday evening at a cost of £80 per box which includes a £20 returnable deposit for leaving the box empty and clean on departure. Shavings can be pre-ordered at a cost of £12 per bale or straw can be pre-ordered at no additional cost; alternatively you can bring your own bedding.

Temporary stables can also be hired for the day from Sunday morning until Sunday evening at a cost of £68 per box which includes a £20 returnable deposit for leaving the box empty and clean on departure. Shavings can be pre-ordered at a cost of £12 per bale or straw can be pre-ordered at no additional cost; alternatively you can bring your own bedding.

Rules and conditions of entry

1. **The onus of a horse being exhibited in a class is on the owner/exhibitor.** A Judge must not judge a horse which he/she has bred, owned, sold or had any financial interest in at any time. (Service fees for stallions and keep for mares at stud are excluded).
2. The Judge's decision is final. Any objections must be made in writing to the Show Secretary within 30 minutes of the class ending with a £50 cash deposit which will be forfeited if the objection is not upheld.
3. The organisers reserve the right to rearrange times, amalgamate, alter or cancel any class and adjust prize money accordingly. The organisers reserve the sole right to interpret regulations, conditions and to finally settle and determine all matters, questions and differences arising from show policy.
4. All horses entered must be registered with either Horse Sport Ireland or the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and in possession of a valid passport. It is mandatory that all exhibitors travel with their horse's passport and that the flu vaccinations are up to date. **Random checks will be made at the Show.** In order for any horse to compete it must have had the primary course of flu vaccinations consisting of two injections given no less than 21 days and no more than 60 days apart. The final booster is given between 120 and 180 days after the primary course and annually thereafter months. Foals do not require vaccinations prior to weaning.
5. All ridden exhibits must be 4 years or over, and at least 153cm (15hh).
6. All riders and handlers must be 16 years or over (18 years for stallions and colts).
7. Stallions must be ridden or handled by an experienced rider of 18 years or over, and must have a red, white and blue ribbon in their tail and white disc on their bridle.
8. All In Hand colts – yearlings, two and three year olds must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler 18 years or over, and must have a red, white and blue ribbon in their tail and white disc on their bridle.
9. **Tack.** Bitless bridles, running gags, Market Harborough's, side, draw or running reins are NOT permitted. Boots are not permitted in any flat ridden class.
10. **Health and Safety.** The organisers accept no responsibility for accidents to spectators, competitors, animals or their property, in connection with and arising from the show. Admission is granted and entries accepted only on recognition of this condition. The organisers accept no responsibility for any injury arising from any failure to comply with show rules.
11. It is the sole responsibility of all riders to ensure that, whilst on horseback they wear appropriate clothing and footwear and a correctly fitted riding hat/skull cap with an integral adjustable harness complying with the minimum current European standards. These hats are compulsory for competitors aged 18 years and under.
12. Should any horse be regarded by judges or stewards to compromise the safety of other competitors or spectators they will be asked to leave the ring.
13. In all ridden classes a fall of horse or rider will lead to elimination from the class.
14. **Children and Dogs.** Parents/Carers of children and young people under the age of 16 are responsible for their supervision at all times while attending the show. Dogs are welcome but MUST be kept on a short lead at all times. No flexi or extending leads allowed.
15. Exhibitors failing to participate in a Championship for which they have qualified will forfeit their prize money.
16. **It is a condition of entry that all owners/exhibitors MUST have Third Party Public Liability Insurance for their horses to compete. Signature acceptance to be confirmed on entry form.**
